ADDENDUM NUMBER 3:

Re: Disaster Debris Collection Specification PD 09-10.050

Gentlemen:

We recently sent you a Request for Proposal on the above-mentioned specification.

This Addendum #3 provides for Questions and Answers as follow:

1) Q: We are working to finalize our proposal and there is a requirement for an occupational license. We have the necessary licensure with the State of Florida, but not an Escambia County occupational license. On other RFP's we have responded to, if an occupation license is required, it is only upon award of contract, not prior to proposal submittal

A: In the checklist it states "should" not shall, therefore it may be acquired in post award.

2) Q: It states in the proposal that beyond required submittals there is a thirty (30) page limit. To clarify, that would mean that for tabs 2-7 (project understanding and technical approach, key personnel, resumes, typical TDSRS site safety plan and operational plan, licenses and certificates, insurance requirements and price proposal) it can only be thirty (30) pages?

A: The thirty (30) page limit excludes required submittals. ("Required Submittals through "Price Proposal") Double-sided documents are acceptable.

3) Q: Under required submittals Section K. Existing Contracts it states that "The Proposer shall provide a listing of current contracts in Alabama and Mississippi." Is this meant to be for these states, or for other locations?

A: Alabama and Mississippi are the correct states. Existing contracts in these two States are more relevant to Escambia based on the County's location on the panhandle of Florida.

4) Q: Will tipping fees at the final disposal location be treated as a pass-thru cost to the City (County)?

A: Tipping fees will be treated as a pass through cost. The Contractor will have to pay the final disposal site and submit an invoice for tipping fees to the County for reimbursement as a pass through cost.

5) Q: It is state that the term of the contract is for three (3) years. Will price adjustments, according to the Consumer Price Index (CPI), or other index be allowed from year to year?

A: No, there is not adjustment for any rate based on CPI.

6) Q: Does the City(County) have designated TDSR sites in mind already, or is the Contractor responsible for locating those, post award, with the help from the City (County)?

A: The County has identified TDSRS locations. However, the County may task the Contractor with finding additional sites as necessary.

7) Q: Does the City (County) have a contract for similar services currently in place, or one that has recently expired, or is the first such contract? If there is a current or recent expired for similar services, could you please forward the bid tabulations and contract documents?



8) Q: We thought we understood the page limit for the proposal but we have questions. Can you identify by Number and Letter which are counted and which are not? I know the Number 1 is marked Required, but 2-8 are also required and especially 7 and 8.

A: The thirty (30) page limit excludes Sections 1-8 (Required Submittals through Price Proposal).
