Hurricane Ivan Situation Update

Curfews:

- The curfew for Escambia County is from midnight to 5 a.m. except for Perdido Key and Pensacola Beach, where curfews remain in effect from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. until further notice.

Price Gouging:

- Complaints on price gouging of services or goods contact State Attorney's Office at 595-4253 or local law enforcement. Please leave a message. Office hours will resume on Tuesday.

Beaches:

- **Perdido Key** will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday, and Monday, Sept 26, and 27. Residents, property managers, leaseholders, business owners, or property owner representatives will be allowed to secure their property and get personal belongings. Proof of residency, ownership, or authority must be presented for access to the Key. Property owners may bring assistance or an emergency contractor with them to help secure their property. Perdido Key will close daily at 5 p.m.
- **Pensacola Beach** will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday, and Monday, Sept 26, and 27. Residents, property managers, leaseholders, business owners, or property owner representatives will be allowed to secure their property and get personal belongings. Vehicles must have a Santa Rosa Island Authority sticker on their vehicle, proof of ownership, or authority for access to the Pensacola Beach. Property owners may bring assistance or an emergency contractor with them to help secure their property. Pensacola Beach will close daily at 5 p.m.
- On Pensacola Beach, road workers have been successful in opening additional roads, including the roadways to Portifino and Ft. Pickens to aid citizen access.
- Santa Rosa Island Authority is trying to get the Hilton Hotel and Hampton Inn opened for emergency workers only during the clean up process.
- In order to minimize the impact on the debris removal, restoration efforts, and emergency aid/response, Pensacola Beach and Perdido Key will be closed after 5 p.m. Monday Sept. 27 to all except:
 - emergency personnel
 - insurance adjusters with credentials
 - building inspectors
 - debris contractors
 - utility workers

- The Santa Rosa Island Authority established a resident hotline at (850) 932-1500 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Distribution Centers:

- The following six sites are open for the distribution of ice, water and food from **8 a.m. to 6 p.m.:**
 - Northview High School – 4100 Highway 4 Century Fl
 - Behind the old Builders Square on Herman Street. (Brent Oaks Mall – 33 Brent Lane has relocated to the northeast lot at this location)
 - Washington High School – 6000 College Blvd.
 - Winn Dixie Shopping Center– Hwy 29 in Cantonment
 - Bailey Middle School, 4110 Bauer Rd.
 - Old Warrington Village Shopping Center – 400 Blk N. Navy Blvd

FEMA Assistance:

- Escambia County residents may apply for FEMA assistance by calling 1-800-621-FEMA. Residents who sustained damage from Hurricane Ivan must register to be eligible for assistance. When you apply for disaster assistance please have the following available:
 - Social Security Number (including spouse)
 - Address and zip code of the damaged property
 - Directions to the damaged property
 - Telephone numbers where you can be reached during the day
- A Disaster Recovery Center (DRC) is established in Century at the Ag Center on Industrial Park. A DRC is a facility where persons can meet face-to-face with represented Federal, State, local, and volunteer agencies.
- Anyone representing FEMA will have credentials indicating they are an official representative.

Building Inspections & Permits:

- The Escambia County Building Inspections Office has returned to their permanent location at 3300 Pace Blvd., Ste 300 and can be reached at (850) 595-3550.
- Building permits for the City of Pensacola can be obtained at the Code Enforcement Building, 2761 North Palafox St. An Escambia County license is required.

City of Pensacola Government:

- The City of Pensacola has established a call-in center to provide updated information to citizens on matters affecting the city and pertaining to Hurricane Ivan and the subsequent cleanup. The center is open seven days a week from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Residents or others with questions concerning sanitation, governmental relocation, code enforcement, public safety, or any other issues pertaining to the City of Pensacola and all of its agencies can call 437-9112.

Pensacola Naval Air Station:

- All residents of Navy mariner Village Housing with units that have been deemed uninhabitable must report to the Crosswinds Clubs onboard Corry Station at 10 a.m. Sunday for updated information on their housing status. For information call 452-6162.
- All employees of Corry Station, Saufley Field and Naval Educations and Training Command Headquarters staff should report for duty at their regularly scheduled time on Monday, Sept. 27.
- All civilian employees who have not been recalled to duty will remain on excused absence, but should call their immediate supervisor if they have not already done so. Civilian employees with questions should call the Human Resources Office at 452-6070 or toll free at 1-877-854-3458, 3459 or 3463.
- Quarters for all Training Air Wing SIX personnel will be held at 9:00 a.m., Monday, Sept 27 at the hanger.
- Chapel Services for NAS Pensacola and Corry Station will be held at the Corry Station Chapel as follows:
 - 0800 – Lutheran
 - 0930 – Roman Catholic
 - 1045 - Protestant
- The NHP pharmacy is open for business between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. When the local curfew is lifted, regular hours will resume (8 a.m. to 8 p.m.). All new prescriptions will be processed at the hospital pharmacy. If unable to call refill in for automated processing (850/505-6459 or toll free 1-888/513-4164) the main pharmacy will process refills at the pharmacy window.
 - The NEX Mall Prescription Refill Center will reopen on Wednesday, Sept. 22, from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m.
 - The Naval Hospital will process new and refill prescriptions for Branch Medical Clinics Whiting Field, NATTC, Corry Station and NAS Pensacola.

Utilities:

- **Emerald Coast Utilities Authority (ECUA)**
 - 28 of 31 water wells are online
 - 230 of 269 mainland (320 total) lift stations are online.
 - Citizens are urged to continue to conserve water.
 - A boiled-water advisory has been lifted for the majority of ECUA customers in Escambia County. However, customers in the Innerarity Island area are urged to continue boiling the water. Boil all tap water that is to be used for

consumption for one minute or add eight drops (1/4 teaspoon) of chlorine bleach per gallon and allow to sit for 30 minutes.

- Citizens are urged to report water leaks by calling 476-0480.

➤ **City of Pensacola Sanitation:**

- Garbage drop-off sites for **household garbage only** on 12th Avenue, Summit Boulevard, and at Legion Field will be open from 12:00 noon to 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, Sept. 26. Regular garbage collection is expected to resume Monday, Sept. 27. Yard debris service will begin on Monday, Sept. 27.

➤ **BellSouth**

- Reporting 80% of customers have phone service.
- Customers can call BellSouth for repair service at:

➤ **Gulf Power**

- Gulf Power officials report that 80% of customers are online and that 58,000 customers remain without power in Escambia County.
- Several areas received extensive damage and it will be next week before power is restored. These areas are: Cantonment, Star Lake, Scenic Hills, Molino, Cordova and central areas of Brentwood.
- To report power problems, call 1-800-GUPOWER (487-6937).

➤ **Escambia River Electric Cooperative, Inc.**

- Close to 75% of Escambia River's service area now has power.
- Call our outage response number 1-800-235-3848 if you see a power related emergency or if your neighbor has power and you do not.

Roads:

- The following are updates on roads and bridges in Escambia County:
 - Highway 90 is open. One lane eastbound will be closed for striping beginning at 8:00 p.m.
 - SR 292 Perdido Key Road: anticipated opening – late January
 - SR/County Road 399 roadway on Santa Rosa Island – roadway is washout out on the sections where it has been viewed (the road is 22 miles long, but getting to the Island has been difficult due to the bridges being out) – being accessed and should be under contracted for repairs by Monday Sept. 27.

- Bob Sykes Bridge is open to emergency vehicles; anticipated opening is Wednesday, Sept. 29
- SR 8 (I-10) Escambia Bay Bridge: anticipated opening – Monday, Oct. 11
- Millview Bayou Bridge (SR 298): anticipated opening – Thursday, Sept. 30 Santa Rosa
- SR 191 Garcon Point Bridge is open. Some minor delays may occur while work is finished. Tolls are suspended.
- Crews from C.W Roberts will continue working to open the entire stretch of US 98 between Fort Walton Beach and Destin to all four-lanes of traffic within 120 days.
- The detour for cars/light trucks will be moved to US 90, the route that is the parallel to I-10, by this weekend and commercial trucks will move to the current detour for cars.
- 80% of all local roads are cleared. The total system should be open by Friday except those areas previously specified.
- 83% of the signals in the impacted area are operating. The remaining signals have a higher degree of damage.
- All local bridge inspections will be complete by Friday.
- A \$26 million emergency project to rebuild the damaged Interstate 10 Bridge over Escambia Bay in Pensacola began today, according to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT).

Escambia County Area Transit:

- ECAT resumed a limited bus schedule today with twelve routes. These routes are:
 - Route 1 at 7:40 a.m.
 - Route 3 at 7 a.m.
 - Route 4 at 6:45 a.m.
 - Route 6 at 7:30 a.m.
 - Route 9 at 7:15 a.m.
 - Route 7a at 8:26 a.m.
 - Route 7b at 7:56 a.m.
 - Route 10b at 7 a.m.
 - Route 11b at 8:30 a.m.
 - Route 15b at 8:30 a.m.
 - Route 16 at 8:26 a.m.
 - Route 18 at 7:45 a.m.
- The routes continue to run every two hours Monday – Friday. There are currently no Saturday or Sunday routes. There are also no evening services. For additional information contact ECAT at 595-3228.

Escambia County Animal Regulation/Control:

- Escambia County Animal Control and The Animal Shelter can be reached at 595-3075 for non-emergency calls, and 595-3080 for emergencies. The Animal Shelter resumed normal operating hours 9 a.m. – 4 p.m. Monday – Saturday.

- Injured wildlife should be taken to the Wildlife Sanctuary, 105 N S Street, Pensacola.

Agriculture/Livestock:

- Hay and feed are available at the Matt Langley Bell Camp at W. Nine Mile Road from 8:30 – 4 p.m. through Sunday, Sept. 26.
- Livestock retrieved since Hurricane Ivan are boarded at Matt Langley Bell Camp.

Burn Ban:

- The Escambia County Board of County Commissioners established an emergency ordinance implementing a Burn Ban for the County until further notice. Low water pressure and water line breaks make burning brush extremely dangerous.

Army Corps of Engineers:

- The Army Corps of Engineers will place temporary roof covering on homes damaged by the hurricane. Residents must complete a right of entry form before work can begin. Call 1-888-ROOF BLU for additional information.
- You may go to the following locations in Pensacola:
 - The Old Builders Square, 1412 West Fairfield Drive from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m
 - Former Winn Dixie, on N. Hwy 29, Cantonment, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
 - St. Ann's Catholic Church, Daniel Dr., Gulf Breeze, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
 - Warrington: Winn Dixie, 400 N. Navy Blvd, 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.
 - McDavid Fire House on Highway 29, 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.
- These are the locations where you need to go to sign the "right of entry" forms to get the blue tarps put on

Schools:

- Need all Hall Center employees to report to work Monday, Sept. 27 at their normal times. If they can't make it they need to contact their supervisors.
- All custodians need to report to the custodial office at the warehouse on Texar on Monday, Sept. 27 at 7:00 a.m.

Pensacola Junior College:

- Employees should return to work on Monday, Sept. 27. All faculty, full-time and adjunct, should first report to a general meeting at 9 a.m. in the Ashmore Auditorium, Pensacola campus. Employees unable to work should contact their supervisors.
- Classes will resume Monday, Oct. 4. The PJC Downtown Center and the NAS Center are closed indefinitely for repairs. Classes normally held at the Downtown Center will be moved to Pensacola campus, Building 10. Classes normally held on NAS will be moved to the Warrington campus, Building 3400.

Public Health/Safety

- The water ban has been lifted in all areas of Escambia County except for Innerarity Island. Residents in this location still need to boil their water before drinking.
- Owners of private wells need to make sure they have checked the water by using the test package that is provided by the Health Department.
- The Dept. of Health has established locations for mobile clinics to provide primary care (other than emergency care):

 - Regular patients should go to Lakeview Center

- Dept. of Health and County Officials are urging all users of portable generators to exercise due care in order to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning. When operating a generator, be sure the generator remains outside the home or business. DO NOT operate a portable generator within a confined space such as a garage or in a home. Carbon Monoxide poisoning can be lethal.
- Fire stations are manned 24 hours a day at Perdido Key and Pensacola Beach.

Debris / Solid Waste:

- The clean-up process will begin this week. Follow these debris separation procedures to expedite clean-up:
 - Vegetative debris (trees, brush, etc.)
 - Construction debris (shingles, etc.)
 - Household garbage
- Place your debris on the right-of-way in front of your property. When doing so, be certain not to hide or cover fire hydrants.
- Officials are asking homeowners to remove all grocery contents from any refrigerated appliances being disposed. These contents are subject to decomposition or decay and should be placed in plastic bags with your normal garbage.
- The City of Pensacola has established garbage drop-off sites for household garbage only on 12th Avenue, Summit Boulevard, and at Legion Field will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday, Sept. 26. Regular garbage collection is expected to resume Monday, Sept. 27.
- Debris drop off sites open daily from 7:00 to 7:00. They are:

Mosquito Control:

- With all the rain and standing water from Hurricane Ivan, Neighborhood Environmental Services Department would like to remind everyone of the Five "D's" for mosquito control.
 - Dusk - Avoid being outside at dusk.
 - Dawn - Avoid being outside at dawn.
 - Deet - Use repellent with DEET as an ingredient.
 - Drain- Remove standing water in any thing that is located in the yard.
 - Dress- Wear light colored clothing and cover all exposed areas of skin.
- Officials state they are in the process of setting up a program for damaged swimming pools to help control mosquito problems.

Water Safety:

- Coast Guard officials established a safety zone that extends both soundside and Gulf side for three miles from the beach. This includes all coastal navigable waters between the west end of Big Lagoon to the east of Destin's East Pass, just off of Joe's Bayou. This restricts any boats from this area. The penalties include potential arrest under State Statute and Civil penalties under Federal Statute.
- In addition, Coast Guard officials are banning marine traffic in the Pensacola Bar Channel, Pensacola Bay Channel, Pensacola Approach Channel, Perdido Pass Entrance, and Perdido Main Channel.
- The Florida Marine Patrol advises boaters to avoid attempting to drive boats towards any barrier island. Missing and sunken boats make this action extremely dangerous.

United States Postal Service:

- Pensacola City and Associates Offices are operating from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.
- The main Post Office at Jordan Street is operational with limited services.
- NAS Branch is closed until further notice.
- Residents should ensure that there is a clear path to their mailboxes for mail delivery.
- The Postal Service is recommending that residents, whose houses were damaged, not change addresses. Please put a hold on your mail and pick it up at the post office.

Escambia County Government:

- Property Appraiser Office will remain closed until further notice.
- Full Tax Collector Office services opened its Warrington and Marcus Pointe branches from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Driver Licenses services are available at the Warrington location only. For additional information, call 438-6500 ext. 252.
- Supervisor of Elections will resume regular business hours (8:00am to 5:00pm) starting Monday, Sept. 27 on the 4th floor of the Old County Courthouse. If you had requested an absentee ballot and now have a different address, you need to call 595-3900.
- Building Inspections will be moving back to their office in the Town and Country Plaza starting Monday, Sept. 27. As they inspect electric panels at homes, they will be placing a green sticker on the meter box to indicate it has been inspected. This green sticker needs to remain on the meter box until further notice.

Insurance Information:

- Citizens should check credentials on anyone who claims to be an insurance adjuster to ensure the adjuster has been processed by the Florida Insurance Council.
